New Fujifilm GFX

Fujifilm's exciting new medium format GFX system is now in stock! We have demo gear you can arrange to try out, and we have delivered a few systems to customers already. Fujifilm is starting to catch up with backorders. Since we've only just received our demo camera, I have not yet had a chance to test it out thoroughly, but based on the preproduction gear I had tried, it is looking extremely promising.

In other Fujifilm news, also in stock is their new XF 50mm f/2R WR prime lens. This compact prime is available in silver or black, is equivalent to a 75mm lens in full-frame 35mm terms, sports a dust and weather resistant design, has fast internal focusing and typically excellent feeling focus and aperture rings. I have now used one a bit and the image



quality is great, with minimal native distortion (very slight pincushioning), nice bokeh and sharp to the corners. It also seems very flare resistant. Following are some shots I took with it on my X-Pro2.





Good Deal on our Last X-T10

We also have one last X-T10 body remaining (in black) that is on clearance for \$710. This is a great deal for someone wanting to get into the X-System, perhaps starting with a small set of prime lenses. As many of you may have seen already, I have some impressive looking 24x36 inch prints at Beau Photo which were taken with my X-E2, which has basically the same sensor and image quality as the X-T10.

Upcoming Firmware Updates

Fujifilm has announced some significant upcoming firmware upgrades to their X-Pro2 and X-T2 bodies. The first of these updates is due imminently, and may already be out by the time you read this. The second round of updates is due in late May. There are a whole lot of interesting enhancements coming to the X-Pro2, including AF-C focus tracking enhancements that should bring the X-Pro2 close to the performance of the X-T2. There are a total of 33 different upgrades, and actually, numerous ones will be for the X-T2 only as they relate to its enhanced video functionality. In addition, there are some recent updates to the X-Pro2 and X-T2 that will allow you to also update the firmware on Fujifilm's EF-X500 flash unit, solving a few bugs that were discovered with that flash. Hasselblad News

Hasselblad have announced numerous new lenses for their mirrorless XID system. First up, and first to ship, will be the new flat-field **XCD I20mm f/3.5 macro** that goes to I:2, or half life-size, and is said to be extremely sharp. It is roughly equal to a 95mm lens in 35mm full-frame terms. It should make for a great portrait lens too. As with the other XCD lenses, it will have a built-in leaf-



shutter that can sync at up to 1/2000 second. The pricing here in Canada for that lens will be right around \$6,000 and we are taking preorders now.

The other lenses that were announced (pricing TBD) are a 22mm (about like a 17mm on 35mm), a 35-75mm zoom

(like a 28-60mm zoom on 35mm) and a 65mm, roughly equivalent to a 50mm lens.

Hasselblad's XID-50c bodies are shipping, although we are still waiting for the special '4416' edition kits. We hope to see some of those in the next few weeks. If you weren't



aware, we do have an XID-50C in our rental dept. too.

Certified Pre-Owned

One other point to note is to look at Hasselblad's oft-updated CPO list, which shows currently available Certified Pre-Owned gear that they have for sale. CPO items have a 6 month factory warranty and the list will indicate a shot count (if relevant) and the item's condition. There are some clean H6D-50C bodies that are starting to show up as CPOs, since people are upgrading to 100 megapixel models now, and with those you can actually order them as a "premium kit" with an enhanced warranty. You can order any of the CPO items from us and as a rough estimate, just multiply the price by 1.35 currently to estimate the landed price in CDN dollars.

Trip followup: Fujifilm XF 23mm f/2 R WR in the California Desert

In mid March, I took an impromptu one week road-trip to the southern California deserts. After years of drought, they finally had lots of rain this winter, and it's said to be the best bloom in nearly 20 years. The media is calling it a wildflower "SuperBloom". I shot with my Fujifilm gear of course, and used the new 23mm f/2 quite a bit. It has turned out to be a fantastic lens and holds its own against its chunkier big brother, the XF 23mm f/1.4. For these desert shots, I was

usually stopping down for greater depth of field, so hiking around the 36°C heat with the lighter lens was a no-brainer. Attached are some photos from the blooming desert, which I took with the great little 23mm f/2...

New Products Announced



Sekonic has changed the face of light metering with the new Sekonic L-858 Speed Master light meter. It was a long time waiting as it was announced at Photokina back in September 2016, but only came to market recently. What makes this meter so amazing along with its many new functions is that it is the first light meter to measure flash duration. Sekonic has packed so much in to this light meter it could be the last light meter you

may ever need. Once you understand flash duration you will be on the road to taking some amazing images where you can capture motion. Sekonic also included an HSS feature. The L-858D is the first meter of its kind that can measure the stroboscopic pulses fired from strobes when they are used for Hi-Speed Sync. Photographers now can accurately measure their lights when they want to overpower the sun or achieve a very shallow depth of field by using HSS.

Like its predecessor the L-758, the L-858D has a built in spot meter, but now the expanded I-degree spot meter has a broad reading range from EV I to EV 24.4 for ambient light and measures flash down to f/2.0. Its viewfinder has a diopter correction and full-information data display.

Sekonic has also returned to offering end users the opportunity to purchase either the PocketWizard or the Elinchrom/ Phottix module to allow you to not only fire your strobes but wirelessly control your strobes right from your light meter. Also worth mentioning is that it is the same meter for photographers and film makers / videographers. Cine features are built into the same meter.

Hensel announces their first battery powered compact flash units.



The Hensel Foris 400 & Foris 800 will be Hensel's first entry into the world of portable battery powered monolights. Starting later in to the race has allowed Hensel to add features that other manufactures may have left out. Due to be released this summer the initial tests and reviews are very positive. Some of the features that look impressive are that you will be able to use a drop in Lithium battery or a plug in AC adaptor. This allows this monolight to work equally well in the studio and on location. What the Foris 400 and Foris 800 will have that some other battery powered Monolights don't have is TTL capability. What is yet to be seen is which camera manufacturers Hensel will chose to release the first TTL transmitters for. Canon and Nikon are the logical choices but Sony can't be far behind. I put a suggestion (not that I was asked) to be

passed on to the design engineers that Fujifilm be included in the lineup of which cameras the Foris will work in TTL mode, and was told they were already considering Fujifilm as a possible choice. That option could also separate them from other manufacturers.

The Foris will also be capable of High Speed Sync (HSS), but what makes them different is that it will have the capability of switchable flash durations for optimizing HyperSync operation. I will certainly be interested in seeing how this feature will work. Also the Foris will be compatible with the newly released Hensel WiFi Remote App.

There is so much going for these units that makes them very attractive, but what we still do not know is what they will sell for. If they place themselves in the middle of the market they will certainly sell very well.

CSA Certification for Your Lights

I want to share an article written by Will Prentice in the PHOTO News Spring issue. It is the first in a series aimed at educating the public on electrical safety matters, and it does matter! This is definitely something to be aware of when you consider purchasing your next set of strobes or continuous lighting.

Electrical Safety Matters Will Prentice

With the advent of international shopping, you now have access to thousands of products not found on store shelves. There are products you wish your local retailer had in stock. There are products that are drastically cheaper. You want the knowledge and service provided by your favorite store and want the lower price found online. So why can't you have it all?

There are many reasons at play; right now, let's focus on electrical safety.

Canada's electrical supply is 120 volts and 60 Hertz. Any product that plugs into a wall outlet must run properly on 120 volt/60 Hertz power. Other countries use supplies from 100 volts up to 240 volts and either 50 or 60 Hertz. Electrical products are generally incompatible between the different voltages and frequencies — that's one reason we have travel adapters. There are some products, such as laptop power adapters and mobile device chargers, that are designed to work over multiple voltages.

Any product that is sold in Canada that plugs into a wall, from battery chargers to strobe lights to computers to lamps, is required to pass safety certification Standards as established by the Standards Council of Canada. This used to be called CSA, or Canadian Standards Association, approval. Each province has their own requirements and lists of approval agencies — a web search for the Electrical

Safety Authority in your province/territory will show you the specific regional requirements.

What are these Standards? The standards detail the requirements for components to properly handle their minimum power requirements – at least 120 volts. There are standards for the diameter of all wiring inside the product and the wiring that goes to the plug for the wall; for the types of resistors and transistors and how the ground wire is attached; for any fuses, internal or external.

Electrical Safety Standards are set not only to ensure the product is designed for our electrical supply, but also to ensure protection devices, such as shut-offs and fuses, are installed in the correct order. Do you know where in the power delivery system the fuse should be installed?

The objective of meeting these Standards is to reduce risk to you, the photographer, and your customers. These risks are usually personal injury, such as fire or explosion or shock hazards.

What does it mean to be Approved? Agency inspectors look under the hood to ensure that everything meets our standards and requirements. This inspection can be done right at the factory or by the distributor who imports the product. If the product meets Standards, an appropriate sticker is affixed proclaiming that product as compliant. If the product doesn't meet Standards, the manufacturer is advised of the necessary changes.

Approved products can also be subject to safety recalls or alerts. Health Canada is responsible for Consumer Product Safety. They regularly publish recall information and notices to keep Canadians informed and safe. Have you received an email from overseas about your battery charger?

Next issue, we'll explore the insurance and business implications of non-approved photography equipment.

One notable new item in our rental pool this month is the new Profoto Air Remote TTL-S for Sony cameras. With it, you can trigger select Profoto monoheads and packs using your Sony



camera, and with the Profoto BI, B2, D2 & Pro-I0, you can even have a TTL mode for fully automatic exposures! With the Air Remote TTL-S, you can even have high-speed sync with the transmitter, and of course, you can also trigger the strobes in manual mode. Please note, that the flash mode must be set to WL and silent mode cannot be used with the remote. \$20/day

Fuji X-T2 Mini Review:

With the popularity of the FujiFilm X series cameras and lenses, I was never able to take out and try the FujiFilm cameras we have in our rental pool. I was finally able to try out our FujiFilm X-T2 and the FujiFilm I 00-400mm f4.5~5.6 telephoto zoom lens on an Anna's hummingbird nest that I found. I was very surprised as to how good the image quality of the RAW files were, and low light/high ISO was not a problem out to 4000 ISO, which is excellent for an APS-C sized sensor! \$125/day

New! Roots 73 Camera Bags

Previously I had mentioned these great Roots bags as a special order only, but there has been renewed interest in them so we have brought some into the store as regular stock. They are all very nice, reasonably priced camera bags that will be great for anyone with a smaller system such as a mirrorless or SLR camera. My favorite is the Flannel & Grey Collection, which I have two of already myself! There are two typically ROOTS collections, which are both classic and some would say very... Canadian.

Grey/Flannel Collection



This collection includes a small shoulder bag that is perfect for a compact camera or small film SLR, a messenger bag which fits a mirrorless or film kit with several lenses and a small backpack, which is great for everyday use with room for camera gear on the bottom and personal items up top. We are now currently stocking the small shoulder bag and the messenger and may also bring in the backpack. For now it can easily be special ordered though! I love these basic shoulder bags and their flannel interior! The dark canvas exterior and brass clasps are very stylish looking, but don't scream 'camera bag' either, which is nice when you are using it as an everyday bag. The messenger bag also opens two ways, with the clasp closures or the buttons for quick access. All the bags are well padded, so your equipment stays safe, and the messenger bag comes with a rain cover. Both also

have rubber feet so that when you set it down you don't have to worry about getting the bottom of the canvas part of the bag dirty or wet.



I have the small shoulder bag and use it a lot for my Pentax Auto 110 camera and all its lenses. I love how small and lightweight it is! I will often take it when I'm out on a walk and want to have a camera but don't feel like being weighed down by a larger kit. You could also fit in a mirrorless camera with a short lens attached for a slick, very streamlined daily carrying bag. If you are one of those people that loves to always carry a small camera, it would be a perfect tiny bag. It also works well for a point & shoot camera of any size with a wallet, phone and other necessities or if you are already carrying a large camera in hand and just want a small bag to put your extras such as batteries, lens caps, a flash or memory cards in. It's a very handy, very small camera bag! The larger messenger bag I also own and keep my whole Pentax K100 kit in it which includes the camera, 2 prime lenses, a tele photo and a zoom lens (with one lens attached.) It's a great day pack for wandering the city taking street photos and it also includes a small pocket in the back for your phone or wallet.

Classic Collection

The Classic Collection is all about the messenger bags. They range in size from extra small to large, so there should be a size for everyone! The extra small is even smaller than the small shoulder bag in the Flannel

Collection, however it includes a loop so it fits onto a belt, as well as a shoulder strap. All of the bags in this collection also have zippered closures instead of the clasp or snap closure that the Flannel Collection have. I like their aptly named "classic" look that is certainly a throwback to retro style camera bags, which includes a sandy colored canvas exterior with leather accents, rubber feet and brass hardware. This line features outer pockets as well and on the medium and large sizes, more pockets and zippered closures inside. The medium and large bags also have the option to remove the drawstring padded camera compartment entirely and use the bag as an everyday messenger style bag. The small, medium and large sizes all also include a rain cover.

Here's an idea of what will fit in each size:



XS Classic Shoulder bag - \$24.00 – Will fit a compact mirrorless camera OR a point & shoot camera.



Fits a mirrorless or film SLR camera with an extra lens or accessory.



M Classic Shoulder bag - \$114.00 - Holds small DSLR or SLR camera with 1-2 extra lenses, small tablet and accessories.



L Classic Shoulder bag - \$133.00 - Will fit standard DSLR camera with 1-3 additional lenses, small tablet and accessories.

Vanguard Camera Bags

We have in a few new bags from Vanguard to add some variety to the camera bag options at a reasonable price. There are quite a few different types but I thought these four would be the most useful!

Alta Fly 49T Rolling bag - \$285.00

This rolling bag will replace the Quovio 49T that we previously stocked. It is very similar to its predecessor with



all its great accessibility and organizational qualities, with even a few more added! There are many pockets inside and out for lots of accessories and it even makes great use of its space at the back where normally a double bar retractable handle would go with two sneaky compartments instead on either side of its T-shaped retractable handle. Its full front access is great for organizing all your gear, but with its snap zipper stoppers and unique shape it allows you to have quick access to your camera kit by only opening the







very top of the front flap when you are ready for action. It is carry-on size and very compact, yet allows you to fit I-2 DSLR bodies, 5-7 additional lenses, a laptop and tablet, 2 flashes and numerous accessories. Includes full coverage rain cover:

Alta Rise 28 Messenger bag – \$103.95 A great sized messenger bag that can hold a DSLR kit with lens attached, 2 additional lenses and a flash, which can all be easily found in its bright yellow interior. It also has the option to



expand the width to accommodate more robust lenses or larger accessories. There is room for a small laptop or tablet up to 10" and cords, cards or other smaller accessories in

more pockets under the front flap. This is a well-padded bag, sure to keep your gear safe, even when expanded. Includes rain cover.





Alta Sky 51D Backpack – \$292.00

This very innovative backpack has many options to access your gear and allows you to even set up two different systems if necessary and keep them separate but easily accessed. The main compartment can be accessed from the front, top or side with room for I-2



DSLR bodies with attached lens (up to 70-200 f/2.8), 3-4 other lenses, flashes and accessories. In the bottom compartment there is room for a compact or mirrorless camera with an additional lens, which can be accessed at the front bottom. If you don't need both compartments for gear you can easily put every day or hiking essentials in one of the sections instead too. In the back there is a dedicated padded laptop compartment as well. There are also plenty of well thought out pockets for organizing your accessories, some of which that can be accessed from both the inside of the bag and the outside, as well as water bottle pockets on either side and a smartphone specific pocket with headset port.

Alta Action 70 Tripod bag - \$45.00

I have also brought in a reasonably priced tripod bag that will fit all of Vanguard's Alta Pro tripods or other tripods up to 70cm in length. Designed to attach easily to the Vanguard Alta bags as well, it is a great companion bag for your smaller tripod to make wearing a backpack and carrying a tripod a lot easier. For carrying the bag on its own, it includes a comfortable shoulder strap as well. It is also well padded to keep your tripod safe and is waterproof all along the bottom to keep it dry when you set it down.










April Means Great Photography Exhibitions and Events all around Vancouver!

Sadly, my Washi – D test was a bit of a flop. I loaded it in my Kodak Retina IIa, which appeared to be functioning optimally. I took a few photos around my apartment and off the balcony, then decided it was safe to venture outside into the snow. After shooting the roll, I had it processed by an expert, who decided that because it is a much thinner

than usual film base she would use a plastic Paterson reel rather than a metal one. It was developed in Blazinal 1:50 for 11 minutes. The frames I shot inside turned out well, however much to my dismay the ones I took outside were VERY underexposed, then faded into not exposed at all..... This very rarely happens. If anything usually goes wrong



with my exposing or camera, it is the photos I shoot inside that don't have enough light. Regardless of the problems, I really liked the few shots I did manage to

get. In my opinion the grain and contrast were pronounced but in a rather pleasing manner. I might try shooting the film on a less snowy much sunnier day next time.

Orwo DP31 Film

My Orwo DP31 Dupe Positive 3ASA test went well.

Though I did have a scare with it too. My Nikon F801 did freeze up when I got to the end of the roll and refused to rewind. Suffice to say my cameras and I are ready for warmer





weather! I took this roll to Rocket Repro for developing and they put it through regular B&W process. It came out how I expected, high contrast and with an interesting foggy effect. Not unlike the Kono Rekorder film. **Orwo 3 35mm** film - \$9.14

Lumen Printing

Now that I have a deck again I am doing a little lumen printing. Lumen printing is when you use any darkroom paper or film (expired or not), and press something against it, sandwiching it between the paper or film and glass. Then UV sunlight (or cloud light) will shine through the glass and flowers (or whatever) onto the paper leaving an impression or shadow of the object burned into the paper.

Afterward you take the things (flowers & glass) off the paper and scan it. If you would like some permanence to your lumen print you would fix it and then rinse it. I have found this changes its tones from pinkier to peachier.
