Some news that came just a little too late to make it into our June newsletter was that Hasselblad has a promo with reduced pricing on their H6D-50c medium format digital camera, now down to \$24,899 CDN (at the current exchange rate), which is an \$11,000 savings compared to the regular price of \$35,899, and that's savings before taxes! This is very nearly as good as some of the former trade-in/upgrade prices, but now you don't need an existing Hasselblad system to trade in! Nikon still has a great deal ongoing for buyers of the D750 and D810 bodies or kits. For purchases between June 23rd and July 13th, get a FREE battery grip with your body! This is a MAIL-IN offer and you can register your purchase on Nikon's website and they will send you a free battery grip! This free battery grip has a retail value (before taxes) of \$599 for the MB-D16 (D750) and a whopping \$749 for the MB-D12 (D810)! However, if you bought your D750 before the promo started, we have a great price on in-stock MB-D16 grips: regularly we have them at \$579 but for July, they are on sale for \$459 while stock lasts!

As far as announcements go, there are several! Nikon has introduced a new AF-S 28mm f/1.4E ED, slotting in between the existing excellent AF-S 24mm f/1.4G and AF-S 35mm f/1.4G lenses. The new Nikkor is continuing on with the tradition of providing electronic aperture control, so those with older film bodies, and even some older digital

bodies, won't be able to use this new lens. I am guessing that going forward, the electronic aperture control will be used on all new high-end full-frame lenses and apart from some compatibility concerns as mentioned, I believe this will be a very good thing for long-term reliability and consistency of exposure. The new "gold-ring" pro-series Nikkor 28mm f/1.4 should have incredible optical performance and will be priced at \$2,599. It is available to order now!

The next interesting lens that was just announced is the AF-S 8-15mm f/4.5-5.6E ED Zoom Fisheye! This lens can go from providing a full 180 degree circular frame on an FX body, to a full-frame rectangular 180 degree diagonal on a DX or FX body. It is also every bit a gold-ring professional lens with all the benefits such as nano-crystal



coatings, weather-sealing, aspherical elements and such. The image quality should be stunning and price-wise, the new 8-15mm fisheye zoom will be \$1,649 and is available to order immediately as well!

Lastly, for those shooting DX bodies, there is an affordable new ultra-wide zoom, the AF-P DX 10-20mm f/4.5-5.6GVR priced at a mere \$399! With 3.5 stops of VR, a



minimum focusing distance of 0.22 meters and an AF-P focusing motor for fast and quiet AF during video, this new lens could prove to be quite a popular ultra-wide-angle zoom! As with the others, it is also available to order now...

Fujifilm GFX News

By the time you read this, we should have Fujifilm's new GFX lenses in stock, the GF 23mm f/4R LM WR and the GF 110mm f/2R LM WR. I had an opportunity to briefly test these two lenses a couple of weeks ago and they performed more or less as I had expected. In other words, fantastic image quality with great control feel and ergonomics. The 23mm has virtually zero barrel distortion, just the slightest hint, so very minimal potentially imagedegrading software correction is required to achieve perfectly straight architectural shots. Despite being an f/4 lens, with the bright EVF of Fujifilm's mirrorless medium format body, there are no issues with a dim viewfinder display. The 110mm will make a fantastic portait lens, with creamy bokeh and a wonderful DOF falloff behind your subject, allowing for superb isolation from busy backgrounds. As a reminder the 23mm lens will be priced at \$3,399 and the 110mm will be \$3,599. Available now!

LEXAR News

In a recent surprise statement, Micron, which is the parent company of Lexar, stated on their blog that they were discontinuing their Lexar removable media storage business! While I haven't heard an official statement from the Canadian Lexar distributor, I take this to mean that all of their memory card products, card readers, workflow docks and so on will soon be discontinued. If you want to read why, read more on their blog posting.

We still have decent stock on many Lexar items, but I think that as we sell through, even if we can still source Lexar, we will be looking at alternative high-end memory card products, perhaps from SanDisk, Delkin, Kingston, Hoodman, Panasonic and for XQD (for those with Nikon D4 and D5 bodies), the only option I am aware of will be Sony, which we can source now. At this point, I need to do some research on the various manufacturer's warranties, speed and compatibility, pricing, stock levels, shipping times etc.

Speaking of warranties, that of course is now a big question with respect to Lexar, and I will be awaiting clarification from our supplier and/or Lexar-Micron directly. Most Lexar products have a limited lifetime warranty, but if the company is going away, one can't be sure of how card replacements will be handled in the future.

Personally, I feel that memory cards, apart from the highest speed and largest capacity, are so affordable these days that if a card dies on me after a couple of years, I'll just shrug and toss it out, feeling that it is not worth the effort to replace. Usually after a few years, older cards will feel cramped and slow anyway, and I'll want to upgrade to the latest and fastest cards. Of course if a card dies shortly after I've bought it, well that's a different story! While there have been some issues with Lexar cards, some of which comes down to very heavy use and/or some abuse (like never using protective cases), they have proven, at least in my case, to generally be reliable. I have never had an issue with any Lexar CF or SD card that I've ever bought, going all the way back to 2004. I still have my five 256MB CF cards (almost

\$400 each!) that I bought back in 2004, which I used with my Canon PowerShot Pro I, and they still work fine in that camera!

Stay tuned for next month's newsletter, where I will hopefully have more information to share on the Lexar situation. Or, just call me and discuss before then if you like...

Manfrotto Pro Light Reloader-55 Rolling Case



New from Manfrotto is the Pro Light Reloader-55 Rolling case. This new rolling case replaces the Pro Roller 50. The new Reloader-55 is a bit larger than its predecessor and holds a few more lenses, flashes or other similarly sized accessories. It will hold 3 DSLR bodies and 8 lenses, or various combinations thereof. It can also now hold larger lenses too! You can carry a DSLR (grip attached) with 400mm f/2.8, a 200-400mm f/4 or a detached 500mm f/4. The internal dividers are easily customizable, making this a great roller for pro DSLR shooters or video shooters... or both! Manfrotto's smart Camera Protection System built in to those dividers keeps your gear safe by absorbing any shock while your bag is in motion.

In the lid there are still lots of pockets for your cards, batteries, cords, etc and on the outside there is a padded, dedicated laptop and/or tablet compartment. They've also updated the look, which I think is very sharp, and treated the high quality Pro-Light Rip-Stop nylon fabric to be water

repellent to aid in keeping your equipment dry. They have also considered that most bags tend to wear out on the bottom and the corners from consistent and frequent use and have paid some special attention to those areas, which means hopefully that will help extend the life of the bag. You can also still carry a tripod on the outside, with its feet tucked into the side pocket and strapped in with the straps provided. This bag is meant to be





carry-on sized for International travel and includes a TSA approved combination lock. Always check with your airline for sizing just in case though! Included is the standard raincover as well.

The Reloader-55 has been very popular since it was announced but was originally backordered...it is now set to land at the beginning of July.

20 Stop ND filters from NiSi

NiSi Filters have announced a 20-Stop neutral density filter named "Black Hole" available in 100mm square, 77mm, and 82mm. This filter will be made from optical glass just like NiSi's 15-stop 10-stop and 6-stop ND filters.

The filter will be packaged in a protective tin case and has a lifetime warranty. NiSi filters states that the filter will only have a slight color cast that it claims is easy to remove in post-production. We are looking forward to testing this fact, including how much IR pollution will be generated, and will report back in a future newsletter.

A neutral density filter reduces the amount of light entering the lens to enable long shutter speeds in normal shooting conditions. The "Black Hole reduces the light by a massive 20 stops with a filter factor ND1000K (6.0), meaning a regular 250th of a second exposure would calculate to a 1 hour and 10 minute exposure.

NiSi will be shipping the product on August 1st.

The Lumen Series Continues


Until now, I have not been fixing my Lumen prints, I've just been leaving them in black bags out of all light so they wouldn't lose their current exposure and get fogged. I had wanted to get it over with by fixing them all at once since I do it in my bathroom and it is a little inconvenient. I really didn't think I had the space to lay them all out to dry, however a few people pointed out that I could stack them if I put watercolour paper between them! Pure genius!

I began fixing them and realized the only disappointing part of fixing the lumen prints is that any blue auras I saw on the original unfixed paper quickly changed colour upon










fixing. The blue auras turned pink, and the pink turned a burnt shade of orange. I fixed the Ilford Double Weight Hard Velvet Stipple Bromide (expiry 1960, - I showed the unfixed image in last months newsletter) which turned in a similar way but retained its teal dots in the flower centre. I fixed my Kodak Tech Pan 4x5 film lumen prints that we also mentioned in last month's newsletter. They lost their


blue aura, however for some reason the blue area turned magenta. It looks pretty neat.






With the above lumen print I used less than ideal glass so when I squished it down I must have pushed too hard and the glass shattered. I left it though, hoping it might look neat, and I think it did. It is an effect I'd repeat if it didn't mean cleaning up a big mess. For this print I used my favourite llford paper., Ilford Ilfospeed Multigrade II Fibre Matt. Sadly because it is my favourite, I am almost out of it.

Solargraphs



We moved in February and I realized we now have the perfect sunrise view so I decided to set up two solargraphs. However, the amount of cloud cover we've had over the past few months meant less obvious sun trails to start

with. Solargraphs are just pinhole cameras that you leave out for months on end to capture the sun or moon trails in the sky. Cylinder tins are my favourite for this sort of



thing. So I used a tall skinny Nescafe tin, which fit 8×10 paper perfectly and a more stout but large Tim Hortons coffee tin. I realized only too late that it was not going to

fit an 8x10 paper tidily, so I now have a 'decal edge' along one side from some last minute ripping. I drilled holes in my tins and fashioned my pinholes from tiny pieces of brass sheet. I used zap straps to hold the Solargraphs to the railing which seemed to hold well. However we did get one big windstorm that jostled them enough to make my skyline a bit of a blurry double. I used Ilford RC glossy paper, which isn't ideal, however it was all I had. It looked pretty good straight out of the can, scanned and inverted in Photoshop (see the photos), however I fixed one of them and it turned pretty white. I put another one on my porch recently and used Ilford Matt fibre paper. We'll see if it is a better option.

Zenit Cameras

Zenit Cameras are Russian made by the company KMZ. To start, they were the Russian version of the German's Leica camera. I feel like after that they took on a life of their own. There are two in our consignment department right now.





The Zenit-E is a 35mm SLR body, made from 1956 to 1986. It is up for \$45.00 for the body only. The other Zenit 35mm SLR we have here is a Zenit-EM. This particular one is in minty condition. It comes with an instruction manual and a fitted case. It has a Helios-44M 58mm lens on it that has an f-stop range from 16 through, 11, 8, 5.6, 4, 2.8 and 2. It sells for \$200.00.

Plaubel Makinette

Probably one of the most unique collectors cameras I've ever had through my consignment department is the rare Plaubel Makinette. Definetly worth coming in to see. Plaubel is a German camera manufacturer that got its

I went out early Thursday morning and shot some Lomography Lomochrome Purple 100-400 35mm. I had heard that some film shooters preferred shooting the Lomo Purple at ISO 400 so I gave it another try. My conclusion is that I still prefer to shoot it slower at ISO 100 or 200. I find it more contrasty and vibrant if shot at a lower speed.



Remembering David Roels 1949-2017

David passed away suddenly and unexpectedly on June 13th.

A Native Vancouverite, David said the Photography bug bit him at a young age. (In grade 6, his desk was next to the class magazine rack and he spent a lot of time looking at the photos in National Geographic when he should have been doing his classwork. Of course, he got caught and they moved him to a different desk).

His Photography career began when, while taking portraits of his friends, he met a photographer at the beach and began helping in his studio. He was introduced to a freelance News photographer and apprenticed with him for two years, learning all aspects of News photography. His photos regularly appeared in the Vancouver Province and via United Press International.

As a freelancer, David moved into Marine, Industrial, Convention and Public Relations Photography and also did photography for Forestry and Mining corporations Annual Reports, but his first love was Portrait Photography. Exhibitions of his portraits of Order of Canada recipients drew critical acclaim. He was a Nationally Accredited Audio-Visual Photographer and Photojournalist.
