SONY Announcements -A7R III and FE 24-105mm f/4G OSS



Sony has just announced a fantastic new mirrorless fullframe camera, the new A7R III. While the actual 42 MP BSI CMOS sensor is essentially unchanged from the A7R II, there are many enhancements to this new model. The easiest way to think of it is as though it were a hybrid of the A7R II and the A9, offering a high megapixel camera with fantastic image quality, combined with the speed and focusing prowess of a camera more geared towards sports and action. We've recently seen a similar camera from Nikon, the extremely popular D850, a camera that pleases photographers no matter what their niche, whether landscape, portrait, wedding, sports, wildlife, or pretty much anything you throw at it. The A7R III will be the same sort of camera, offering the amazing dynamic range of its highres sensor, even said to be improved over its predecessor with refinements to its readout circuitry, but with the speed of a sports camera, offering up to 10 fps shooting at full-resolution, with full focus tracking and a very generous 87-shot raw buffer when shooting 12-bit compressed raw. This drops to 28 frames for the much larger 14-bit



uncompressed raw file sizes however.

Like the A9, the A7R III now has a dedicated focus joystick that allows for far easier positioning for the camera's AF

point, allowing one to easily choose one of the many 399 phase-detect AF points. There is also a dedicated AF-ON button for those action shooters when prefer back-button AF. The A7R III is said to have the same amazingly tenacious subject lock focus tracking as the A9 with very effective face and eye-detection as well. The EVF has been improved with a new 3.69 million dot OLED with a 1280x720 pixel

resolution, there is a new, larger and higher capacity battery with twice the shooting capacity of the older one, the rear LCD is now touchscreen, and 4K video quality has been enhanced as well. All that, along with some UI improvements should prove to be very welcome upgrades over the previous model!



There is also a new shutter mechanism with a rated life of 500,000 actuations. It is said to have much less shutter shock which contributes to sharper handheld images. The sensorshift IS system is also upgraded to 5.5 stops of stabilization, which now also works when capturing video. There is even a multi-shot "pixel-shift" shooting mode which can take 4 photos with sub-pixel shifting of the sensor, allowing for a full RGB capture, with the ability to capture images with accurate red, green and blue intensity for each pixel. Note that this is not something that will be done in-camera, rather you will need to download special software from Sony to assemble the 4 raw files into the final complete RGB image.

This should offer images that are impervious to colour moiré, as well as improving on the appearance of fine details in certain parts of some images. One last bit of good news is that the A7R III is not all that much more expensive than its predecessor was, prior to the current rebates at least. The A7R III will begin shipping at the very end of November for \$3,999.

The second announcement is for a lens that many have been waiting for: a high quality, yet lightweight FE 24-105mm f/4G OSS stabilized zoom. The lens will only weigh 663 grams, so it will be a perfect walk-around and travel lens, finally delivering on the promise of a lightweight and high quality full-frame mirrorless kit with a solid zoom lens offering. Since the MTF charts for the lens look extremely promising, there should be little in the way of compromise when it comes to image quality, even when compared to the much heaver and more expensive 24-70mm f/2.8 G Master zoom for example. If you can make do with an f/4 zoom and aren't frequently shooting in low light or needing the fastest possible shutter speeds, then this will be a lens that almost every Sony E-mount owner will probably want to buy! It will also ship at the very end of November and will be \$1,699. I am very much looking forward to testing both the A7R III and new 24-105mm zoom once we get them into stock and I will provide a more detailed report once I do!

Fujifilm X-E3 - Field Report



I recently had an opportunity to test out the new Fujifilm X-E3 for a few days and I must say that I am more impressed than I thought I'd be. I am very much a buttons and mechanical controls sort of guy, loving my X-Pro2, so eliminating so many customizable buttons and adding a touchscreen to the X-E3 didn't really appeal at first glance. However there are many well thought out and implemented features on the X-E3, and after using one in person, I have grown to quite like it. The only thing I'd have to do right away, is buy the optional metal handgrip for it, just to make the diminutive body a bit easier to hang onto.

Here are a few highlights of note...

While not quite as good as the EVF in the X-TI or X-T2, the X-E3 has an extremely sharp and detailed electronic viewfinder. You now can enable a live, blinking overexposure preview in the viewfinder too, so you can immediately see where highlights might be clipping with your current settings.

The shutter speed and exposure compensation dials have a very nice and firm feel and I don't get a sense that there will be many instances of them moving by accident.

The new front control wheel, which the X-E2s/X-E2/X-E1 did not have, can now be set to allow for quick and convenient setting of the ISO. Pressing in this same wheel

can toggle it to allow you to set shutter speeds in 1/3 stop increments. However crucially, when you select the 1/180 X-sync speed on the shutter speed dial when using flash, that 1/3 stop shutter speed tuning with the front control wheel is disabled, preventing you from accidentally setting a speed higher than the max flash-sync. Nice!

The focus joystick is, of course, fantastic for direct access to all those focus points, but it also turns out to be very nice to use for menu navigation as well, so I didn't really miss the absent curser-pad (D-pad) for that.

The touchscreen is great for quickly zooming in on shots during playback, and the "flick-panning" feature will get you to the extreme edges or corners of a zoomed in shot *way* faster than using the mechanical buttons!

The little X-E3 feels very fast, with responsive controls, quick AF, and a lag-free UI. Image quality was great too, and totally on par with my X-Pro2.

What didn't I like? Well there were only a few things...

The four programmable swipe gestures of the touchscreen, swiping in from the left, right, top and bottom edges of the LCD screen, are fairly easy to get used to, but when holding the camera up to your eye, they are much harder to use than a traditional programmable function button. In addition, the virtual focusing trackpad feature of the LCD touchscreen seemed nowhere near as efficient or precise as selecting a focus point using the joystick. But... the camera has that great focus-point joystick, so it doesn't really matter that the virtual trackpad feature doesn't work all that well. Plus, to me it seems as though some of the deficiencies of the current touchscreen implementation could easily be improved upon in future firmware updates, and Fujifilm certainly has a great track record for improving products from user feedback!

There is now an image review screen that offers a large, RGB histogram and a blinking clipped highlight warning, but nearly half of the image is obscured by the RGB histogram display, so while I really like the idea of a large, fullscreen image showing clipped highlights, this implementation

isn't great. The only clear, unobstructed view of clipped highlights in the whole image, is with the regular information screen than has the single average histogram display, the same as all the previous cameras, and that image is very small. Fujifilm should look to Nikon when it comes to being able to fine-tune all the image review screens exactly to one's liking.

No more cool, tilting popup flash! Fujifilm now supplies the little hot-shoe, clip-on flash that also comes with the X-TI and X-T2, but sadly that flash cannot pivot up to bounce, something that the built-in flash of X-EI and X-E2 were capable of. This was actually quite useful when taking quick fill-flash shots if you had a standard, eight foot high white ceiling to bounce from.

The thumb-ridge "bulge" seems to be an added on piece and is not moulded with the rest of the body, and so it doesn't feel quite as solid as it would otherwise. There is a slight "creak" when putting pressure on it, and while it most certainly doesn't feel weak, it also makes the camera feel a little less impressively solid than it probably would otherwise. Then again, I am likely spoiled by the tank-like solidity of my X-Pro2, so keep in mind the context of my comments!

So not really much to complain about in the end and I was more impressed than expected. The X-E3 is a fantastic, super compact camera that I really quite enjoyed shooting with! While it may seem like a step down in some ways from its predecessors, the X-E3 certainly doesn't feel like it's been overly simplified to the point where it won't appeal to enthusiast photographers anymore. If I was still shooting with an X-E2 as a main camera, and didn't already have an X-Pro2, I would definitely buy one for myself...

iOptron SkyTracker Pro - in stock

We've received a partial shipment from iOptron and now have the SkyTracker Pro in stock. While I haven't had a chance to take it out and test it, what with the crappy weather we've had on weekends lately, I have found that



it has some really nice improvements over the previous model that I currently own. You now have an adjustable alignment scope illuminator light with numerous brightness levels. I always found mine to be a little too dim, needing fully dark adapted eyes to easily

see the markings, but now the brightness can be adjusted from very dim to fairly bright. The new mount offers much more solid adjustments and locking clamps for altitude and azimuth aim when doing polar alignment, so the procedure should end up being a lot easier than with the older model. There are now solar and lunar tracking rates as well, so if you are trying to follow the moon or sun, during an eclipse for example, you now will have no more drift. Lastly, there is a fast back and forth slewing option which could help you electronically fine tune a composition if your aim happens to be out by a small amount.

We will have the new SkyTracker available to rent, should you want to try it out. Backorders of iOptron's higher end SkyGuider mount should finally be in stock sometime closer to the middle of November, with apologies for the delay to those who have one order.

Fujifilm REBATES - finally back!

Many of you have been waiting patiently for sale pricing to come back on Fujifilm bodies and lenses, and finally, you're wait is over! While not everything is on sale, much of it is (and running right through to the end of the year too!), so I'll start by detailing the deals on Fujifilm's medium format digital GFX system...

First off, if you buy the GFX-50S body and any lens to go with it (which you would of course need), you will

get between \$1,225 and \$1,300 off the bundle. Buying just a body, for example if you already have a system and want a backup, is not discounted though, so that will still be \$8,125. In terms of lenses however, there are individual rebates, however they won't "stack" with body+lens bundle which has a total of \$1,300 off max. Here are the GFX lens rebates...

As far as rebates go, early this month Nikon really has nothing to speak of (mainly some consumer lens bundles), but stay tuned since there may be Black Friday deals coming at the end of the month! As far as the D850, we are essentially now caught up with pre-orders and hope to actually have stock on the shelf soon! However, we still have not seen any MB-D18 battery grips arrive, nor the new ES-2 film digitizing adapter. Hopefully November will see shipments start on both of those highly anticipated products!

Hasselblad

There has just been a huge price drop on Hasselblad's superb H6D-50C medium format digital camera. This camera used to be well over \$30,000 CDN, but now at the current exchange rate, it is only \$18,599, less that what the trade-in/upgrade pricing was in the past! This is a great time to buy a new Hasselblad, especially if you already have HC lenses on hand! You could either keep your old digital H-series Hasselblad as a backup, or sell it by either consigning it here, or selling it privately. The backlog of X1D-50C orders is finally over and now, new orders should ship quite swiftly from Hasselblad USA. In addition, our early release rental/demo X1D-50C has returned from Hasselblad's factory for a minor upgrade and it is working better than ever now, especially with all the new firmware enhancements.

SONY

As usual, Sony has ongoing rebates that can sometimes change weekly, so contact us for details. Two rebates of note however, (which are over on November 9th), are a whopping \$500 off sale price on the 42 MP A7R II body, only \$3,199 during the period. Fantastic savings! Secondly, the I2MP low-light monster A7S II is \$300 off and also at \$3,199. Note that we now have Sony's excellent new full-frame ultra-wide I2-24mm f/4G lens on hand for \$2,299.

This Rolleiflex Model K8 – T1 (2100950) was manufactured from October 1958 - June 1961, and is finished in a lovely grey leatherette. It's fitted with a Zeiss Tessar 75mm 3.5 taking lens and a fast shutter speed of 500. Most TLR's take 12 square 6x6 photos on 120 film – however some, including this one, have another mask and alternate frame counter adapting the camera to 16 rectangle images on a 120 roll.

Rolleiflex cameras use a bayonet system to mount filters and attachments. This camera uses 'Bay I' sized filters and adapters. The selenium light meter is non-functioning, however it has recently had a CLA to ensure its slow shutter speeds are accurate.

This particular Rolleiflex TLR camera will be sold with its original box, fitted leather case and lens cap. It is listed on consignment for \$1200.00






