Tested! Fujinon XF 8mm f/3.5 R WR Ultra-Wide (NEW - \$1,080)

While in Victoria on recent week long vacation, I had the opportunity to test out Fujifilm's widest X-System prime lens yet, the Fujinon XF 8mm f/3.5 R WR. It was a preproduction lens, and supplied to me without a hood, but it still performed admirably! For the full review, with

In summary...

- Great build quality
- Flare resistant
- Generally very sharp across the frame, even wide open, with excellent corners by ${\rm f}/{\rm 5.6}$

- Surprisingly low vignetting
- Compact and light
- Has some barrel distortion and chromatic aberration, both of which are autocorrected in most raw converters. Despite required software correction, image quality remains on a very high level.
- Consistent colour from corner to corner, far better than the Laowa Zero-D 9mm f/2.8 for example.



I was actually quite surprised at how well the new XF 8mm f/3.5 R WR performed. Given its compact dimensions and ambitious focal length, I was not expecting it to perform as well as it did. In the end, despite a few minor flaws, when you consider all aspects of it performance, I personally feel that it is overall a better

lens than the Laowa 9mm f/2.8 (which I own as well). Fujifilm did an excellent job in my view, balancing size, weight, cost and optical performance. It's likely that I'll eventually replace my Laowa 9mm with the new Fujinon XF 8mm f/3.5 R WR. I definitely recommend this lens if you are looking for an extremely wide-angle rectilinear prime lens for your Fujifilm kit!

A Case for Nikon

As our customers pass through our store, I find myself studying what catches their eye. Of course our case of goddess Leicas. And everybody always comments on the Rolleiflex Aurum before sauntering over to the beefy Baldas. And there was that week of Braun Paxettes. A few take a gander inside the free bin, and all ignore the boxy Brownies. Questions are asked, usually about the Canon AE-1 "Do you have it in stock?" On occasion, the Pentax K1000 is desired.

A wide glass counter for film cameras rests facing the fridges. Ranging right to left towards the DISPLAY ONLY sign sit the Asahi Pentaxes, Konica Auto Reflexes, Contaxes,

Ricohs, Minolta SRTs, Canon EFs & FTs, all with an assortment of lenses in between. All of these are noble pursuits. I, however, want to make a case for you to visit our often neglected, hidden ... glass Nikon case.

Now that I think of it, we might need to put a BIG "Neon" Sign on it. How will you know if you don't see the case? People always forget we have a Nikon case, full of goodies that aren't always noticed. I know because new customers tell me "I didn't know you have a Nikon case". Ah, we sure do, a top shelf full of sturdy Nikkormats



that will survive an apocalypse with their simple and sturdy builds, designed for the consumer, all accepting Nikon's F-mount lenses. Many are selling for under \$200. There is a Nikkormat FT N selling for only one hundred bucks! Below, on the second and third shelves are a treasure trove of pre-Ai, Ai, and Al-s lenses, of all focal

lengths. If you own an F Series, you're bound to find the lenses you have been looking for.

Nikon built things to last. And I want my camera to be a rugged, trustworthy mate. Currently, we also have the Nikon F3 on sale for \$450, as well as its price compromise, the Nikon N2000 with a w/ Series E 50mm f1.8, on sale for \$180. Both are battery-powered, with the F3 being arguably Nikon's lightest pro-SLR, remaining in production for over twenty-one years. The Nikon N2000 was Nikon's first internal, automatic film winding camera. Do stop by and find the case, you will be pleasantly surprised.

Colour Film at Beau

Last summer, I wrote a blog post about how colour film was hard to find. With Kodak's lack of available colour film being a strong topic of discussion last year, this year our fridge has been as full as ever!

With the influx of new customers looking to get into film, I wanted to go over the basics and answer the ever popular question: what's the difference between all the films you carry?

Here's a rundown of all of the C41 and E6 film we have in stock...

Kodak



Kodak Gold 200 (35mm: \$15.28, 120: 21.66 - C41) – Strong bronzes & gold tones. Cheap and cheerful, and perfect for summer!

Kodak Ultramax 400 (35mm: \$17.57 - C41) – All purpose & versitile with saturated colours. Cheap and cheerful, but brighter!

Kodak Ektar 100 (35mm: \$26.81, 120: \$26.19 - C41) – A personal favourite with super fine grain, strong warm tones and very vivid colours. One of the best films for golden hour.

Kodak Portra 160 (35mm: \$25.81, 120: \$26.42 - C41) – Extremely fine grain, wide exposure latitude and low contrast. Accurate skin tones make the film perfect for portraits.

Kodak Portra 400 (35mm: \$29.62, 120: \$28.58 - C41) - Pleasing warm skin tones, fine grain. Wide exposure latitude makes the film excellent for overexposing.

Kodak Portra 800 (35mm: \$32.87, 120: \$35.54 - C41) – Essentially Portra 400 but more grain, stronger greens, and 800 ASA.

Kodak Ektachrome 100 (120: \$36.95 - E6) – Daylight balanced slide film with a strong blue cast in the shadows. Fine grain, vivid colours but barely any exposure latitude.

Fujifilm 200 (35mm: \$15.99, \$31.95/Pack of 3 - C41) - Basically Gold 200

Fujifilm 400 (35mm: \$17.50 - C41) - Basically Ultramax 400



Velvia 50 (35mm: \$26.60 - E6) - Very saturated colours with a strong contrast. Favours saturated reds.

Velvia 100 (35mm: \$26.60 - E6) - Newer emulsion with a strong magenta cast and brighter highlights. Maintains saturated colours and strong contrast like its 50 equivalent.

Lomography

Lomography 400 (35mm: \$22.80 - C41) - Strong contrast & saturated colours. Similar to Ultramax 400

Lomography 800 (35mm: \$28.56 - C41) – Another personal favourite with fine, yet present grain. Slightly cooler than Kodak films with deeper blues and greens, but maintains pleasing skin tones.

Customer Spotlight #2

Because I think the regular customers are the best part of this job, I thought I'd start badgering them into sharing some of their favourite film cameras, and thus the "Customer Spotlight" was born.

This month Bob was kind enough to share a few thoughts about one of his more favoured cameras.

A camera you think is fun to use?

Wow, where do I start? Certain cameras I feel so blessed and privileged to use – are also fun because of their nostalgic value such as the Canon AE-1 program, then a couple of other Canons and a few Nikons . Of all my small format cameras, the Canon AE-1 Program was the first serious step into my photographic journey. I remember going with my dad into the local Credit Union where he agreed to co-sign a loan for me so that I could buy a camera. At the time, the AE-1 Program had just come out and the store didn't have a lot of selection, so that was the one I chose. And then after some time, my mother, unbeknownst to me at the time, paid off the balance for me, gotta be grateful for supportive parents.



I had a lot of fun using that camera, and developing my photographic technique and visual voice. As I grew as a photographer, my desire for gear to help me make other types of images was realized only many years later when I was working full-time and could afford to enter the wonderful world of large format photography. I suppose if I had

to select a desert island camera it would probably be my Toyo 45 A II, which is a true joy to use because it is NOT easy, that's correct, it is a camera that demands a certain discipline to technique and routine – for myself I find fun in the challenge. However, large format photography is not an exclusive form of imaging, it just takes

a bit more care to a consistent routine, which with practice, can become feasible for many folks. Oh, and one more thing, you need a strong back because you're carrying not just a camera body, but all the accessories, so for instance my camera pack weighs about 11 Kg., but that doesn't bother me too much.

I remember when purchasing the Toyo brand new as a kit, it was quite an experience and then the sales clerk explaining to me how to load film ... in Japanese. Well, I took as much as I could from the kind



explanation and proceeded cautiously, along with periodic visits to the camera store in Osaka when the camera rep was there to promote products and help with technique. Actually that is where I learned about the unique rotating back to make interesting images with the Toyo.

After practicing film photography for many years, one observation I have made is that to become a proficient photographer it takes persistent practice – don't throw in the towel – get help, and today unlike the past, there is a plethora of avenues one can turn to for assistance. For example you can contact the knowledgeable people at BEAU PHOTO, online videos, or photography clubs may be of some assistance. Whatever photographic format you find resonates with you, i.e small (35mm), medium (120), or large (4x5 ...) format, it should be fun and it can be fun.

For example when out on a photo-walk it is exciting to see what other cameras people are using and to share camaraderie around a common interest and build your network of fellow photographers who may be able to help with some of your questions or at least provide an opinion. At any rate, sharing the passion for analogue photography is a great privilege and at some point – I feel is a responsibility to assist the next generation.

What you like about it?

When it comes to large format photography I especially like looking at large format reversal film or black & white negatives upon my light table, so much minute detail when I get everything just right (doesn't happen all the time). I also like the fact that it is a slow, methodical process and in a world that wants everything "yesterday"

and moving at Mach 1.0, I find it quite therapeutic to take my time and deliberately invest in fine-tuning my photographic skill set. By the way, I also find my time in the darkroom to be a therapeutic process. As a photographic artist I consider myself to still be a work in progress, and large format photography and working with reversal film keeps challenging me to improve. Now, because of its slow nature you may find that large format photography is not suited to many other forms such as sports, street, or wherever quick response and mobility are essential to the event. On the other hand, large format photography is best suited to genres such as landscape/nature and architectural photography.


Regarding my particular camera I also like the fact that I do not need to physically remove the film back to change from vertical to horizontal – as my version has a smooth rotating back through 360° of motion. And finally batteries are not required to operate the camera itself.

Do you have an anecdote about a camera?

At one point I thought I would try a different brand of camera, the Chamonix, which was lighter, being of a wooden construction unlike the Toyo that is metal. Soon after I got the new camera, I realized I had made a big mistake, although it was lighter, and seemed like a very good camera, I missed the features of my old Toyo and for me, I also realized that weight wasn't an issue. So, I got rid of the Chamonix (practically brand new) and found a used Toyo 45 A II that was in pretty good shape. I've never looked back although I still regret parting with my new Toyo.

These days I would really like to try out a Gibellini 4x5 camera and the accompanying accessories or a 6x17 panorama back for my Toyo camera.

The Lomography Sprocket Rocket is a unique and fun film camera that allows you to capture panoramic photos that include the sprocket holes on the edge of 35mm film, visible on the final image. Here are my thoughts on the camera...

The Sprocket Rocket features a plastic body that feels sturdy and well-made. The camera has a retro design that is reminiscent of old film cameras. It comes in a variety of colors, so you can choose one that suits your style, however the only color we have here at Beau Photo is the black, which is going for \$99.00.

The camera features a wide-angle lens that captures a 106-degree field of view, which allows you to capture awesome panoramic shots. The camera also has two shutter settings (1/100s and Bulb) and two aperture settings (f/10.8 and f/16) that give you a degree of control over exposure. The camera has a hot shoe for attaching a flash, and it also has a tripod mount for more stable shots.

The Sprocket Rocket is easy to use, and it is great for beginners who want to experiment with film photography. The camera is entirely manual, so you need to set the shutter speed and aperture yourself, but the camera has a handy exposure guide to help you get the right settings. It also has a built-in leveler that helps you level the camera when shooting panoramas.

This camera produces unique and interesting images with a distinct analog look. The image covers the sprocket holes on the film, which adds an extra layer of coolness to the final result. The wide-angle lens produces decently sharp images with good color reproduction, but there is some distortion at the edges of the frame.

Overall, the Lomography Sprocket Rocket is a fun and unique camera that can




produce interesting panoramic images with a retro look. It is easy to use and great for beginners who want to experiment with film photography.
